Huerto de La **Familia Organic** Garden


This Organic Garden Program offers Latinx and immigrant families the opportunity to grow their organic vegetables, fruit, and medicinal plants in six community gardens in Lane County. All of the services and workshops are offered fully in Spanish, and anyone is welcome to join.

Gardening is more financially accessible because each garden member has access to communal tools and supplies such as seeds, plant starts, and organic fertilizer. Members are also offered one-on-one garden support and other learning opportunities related to beekeeping, food preservation, composting, seed saving, and more. Many of these programs are led by members in a peer-led learning style. These gardens are spaces for the Preservation of Cultural Traditions around agriculture and food, building relationships, and strengthening community.

Families maintain their plot of land and have total autonomy over what to grow. The gardens offer members the opportunity to preserve traditional foods while also increasing their overall health and economic security for their households. Community-building is central to the program. Throughout the year, people come together to care for the gardens with community work parties and garden maintenance days. Many community celebrations are held and honored, such as the annual Fiesta de la Cosecha, a baile folklorico in the gardens, and the pressing of fresh apple cider in autumn.

Environmental stewardship is practiced with the use of organic materials and practices in all of the gardens. Everyone's actions must protect the water, soil, and biodiversity of the land that

is cultivated. Educational opportunities are provided to teach about organic practices and the unique agricultural climate of the Pacific Northwest. Siembra la cena (Seed to Supper) is a class taught by the garden staff team. The curriculum is developed by Oregon Food Bank and OSU Extension, teaching how to grow food from planting seeds.
