CENTRAL'S 2025 CHRISTMAS PROJECT: A Final Report

The Christmas Project is one of the ways that Central fulfills its mission to be a

caring, inquiring, inclusive community of faith. The Board of Deacons handles the organizing, but the heart of the Christmas project comes from you, the members and friends at Central.

This year, Central worked alongside three other churches and a fourth organization to help a total of 57 families from Rainbow Village Apartments, which offers low-income housing through a nonprofit corporation run by local Presbyterian churches. Central was responsible for 20 families (29 adults and 13 children). Central, acting alone, also included an additional two families (4 adults and 4 children) from Bridgeway House. Each family received a Christmas stocking containing a Christmas card, a WINCO gift card, matched to the size of the family, to purchase food, a WALMART gift card so parents could buy Christmas present for each child (or presents for a single adult living alone).

One Central member feels very strongly that if single adults receive gift cards, then all the other adults at Rainbow Village should also receive gift cards to buy presents for themselves. This was so important to them that they personally funded doing that this

year in hopes that this will become a tradition.



On Saturday, December 13, a small group of deacons assembled Central's Christmas stockings. On Sunday, Pastor Jennifer blessed the Christmas Project during the worship service, and on Monday, the 15th, the stockings were delivered to the office at Rainbow Village Apartments.

Each colorful Christmas stocking was unique, a tangible sign of God's love at work through Central. Central Presbyterian Church truly is "Blessed to be a blessing."

January/February Coin Offering Equity Corps of Oregon

Equity Corps of Oregon (ECO) is the recipient of the

January/February 2026 Coin Offering. This is a state program of "universal representation" for low income immigrants. Catholic Community Services is a referral resource.

While our state has long relied on the contributions of immigrant Oregonians to our local and state economics, state policies and programs have systematically excluded people based on their immigration status. Oregon Worker Relief (OWR) has been a lifeline for immigrant Oregonians through programs including Climate Change Fund, the Home Fund, Universal Representation, and more. OWR's community-led approach has helped over 93,000 immigrant Oregonians with emergency relief for farm

workers who face dangerous working conditions from extreme heat and wildfires, rent assistance to keep families housed, and no-cost immigration legal services.

Universal legal representation helps keep Oregon families and communities whole by safeguarding against unjust deportation. Without this representation, immigrant Oregonians are more likely to be deported, regardless of the merits of their case. When this happens, our entire state suffers.

ECO provides funding through grants and contracts to build legal services, programs, support community navigation, and create community educational workshops and classes. For more information, please check out their website at <https://equitycorps.org>.


